Regulations for fishing within Åmot Elvelag's area 2021

Regulations apply to Glomma, Søndre Rena m/Løpsjøen til Storsjødammen, Åsta, Julussa and Søre Osa to Valmendammen within Åmot kommune.

Note! Pay attention to restricted areas and the fly-fishing only zone.

1. Fishing license:

Anglers over 16 years of age must purchase a fishing license. Licenses give the right to fish with 1 rod at a time. Licenses are personal, and non transferable. Only valid with legal ID.

Children under 16 fish for free. Åmot Elvelag asks that children also follow the regulations to ensure sustainable resource management.

Between Glomstadfoss bridge and Rena bridge (old bridges) it is also allowed to fish with a planer board.

Fishing licenses must also be purchased for ice fishing. Løpsjøen has it's own license.

Failure to follow regulations will result in a fine and or reporting to authorities. Repeated infractions will result in confiscation of licenses and may result in a denial of future license purchase.

2. Min – max size limit:

Fish under the minimum/over the maximum size must be released even though they may be injured.

<u>Søndre Rena, upstream from Løpet dam:</u> Trout: No bag limit or size limitations on stocked fish (adipose clipped)

. Bag limit of one wild fish per angler per day. Wild fish over 40 cm must be released. Grayling: Bag limit of 1 grayling per angler per day. Fish over 40 cm must be released.

<u>Søndre Rena, downstream from Løpet</u> <u>Dam:</u>

Trout: No bag limit or size limitations on stocked fish (adipose clipped)

. Bag limit of three wild fish per angler per day. Wild fish over 40 cm must be released.

Grayling: Bag limit of 3 grayling per angler per day. Fish over 40 cm must be released.

Glomma:

Minimum size limit for trout and grayling is 30 cm. Bag limit of 5 grayling and 5 trout per angler per day.

3. Authorities:

All authorities, or anyone else who shows a valid fishing license, has the right to request another anglers license. Anglers must show their fishing license and the equipment they are using upon request.

4. Statistics:

Anglers have the responsibility to give information regarding their catches and use of equipment, etc..

5 a. Restricted dates:

In addition to the Innlandet managed regulations (for example protection of 15.09-31.10), the following regulations also apply.

Søndre Rena: All fishing is forbidden between 1. december to 30. april. Excepted from this regulations is Løpsjøen from Løpdammen to Grasegga øst and Vadeplass vest, where the restriction on fishing only includes trout. Targeting trout is forbidden after 15. September

Søre Osa: All fishing is forbidden between 15 September to 31 May on the grounds of regulations in Osensjøen.

All trout caught during these restricted dates must be released immediately even if they may be injured.

5 b. Restricted Areas:

The restricted zone downstream from Løpdammen includes the first pool to the tailout of the pool where marked.

6. Allowed Equipment: Søndre Rena:

- All fishing must be done actively. No unattended lines allowed
- Use of baitfish is strictly forbidden.
- Barbless hooks only. Barbed hooks must have the barbs pinched.
- A maximum of 3 hooks are allowed, for example 3 single hooks or 1 treble hook.
- Fishing with worms in Søndre Rena is only allowed if a circle hook is used.
- Anglers are required to have a knotless landing net and a measuring tape.

7. Fishing from bridges:

All fishing from bridges is strictly forbidden.

8. Fishing from boats:

Fishing from boats (including kayaks, belly boats, etc.) is not allowed from Storsjødammen to Rødhammeren (see map)

9. Fishing closures:

Fishing may be closed abruptly due to water temperatures, water levels, etc.

The fly fishing zone

The fly fishing zone extends from Storsjødammen downstream to Rødhammeren (see map). This section is roughly 5 km long.


The fishing regulations for Åmot Elvelag's area apply here. The following regulations come in addition:

Allowed equipment:

Fly fishing only, where the fly line allows for the casting weight.

Fishing from a boat:

Fishing from a boat (including canoe, kayak, belly boat, etc.) is strictly forbidden in the fly fishing zone.



Regulation for fishing in Storsjøen, Rena, and Mistra, including all tributaries, in Reendalen and Åmot Kommune, Innlandet.

The state administrator in Innlandet has, in consultation with the Inland County Municipality on 1 March 2021, pursuant to regulations of 26.06.09 on fishing for inland fish etc. and catching of crayfish § 4, cf. Act of 15 May 1992 no. 47 on salmonids and inland fish etc. § 34, applied regulations for fishing in Storsjøen, Rena and Mistra and their tributaries, Rendalen and Åmot municipalities, Innlandet.

§ 1. The purpose of the regulations are to protect the large trout stock from over-taxation, while also allowing other fish species to be utilized to the greatest possible extent in a sustainable manner.

§ 4. The fishing season in Søndre Rena, Nordre Rena and Mistra as well as other tributaries / streams within the scope of the regulations - Fishing for trout is permitted in the period from 1 May to 15 September. The trout caught outside this

period must be released where caught immediately. Other fish species can be targeted all year round.

§ 5. Minimum and maximum size

limits in Søndre Rena, Nordre Rena and Mistra as well as other tributaries / streams within the scope of the regulations - The trout with a length of less than 25 cm from the tip of the snout to the outer tail flap must be released immediately. From and including 20 August to and including 15 September, all trout with a length greater than 40 cm must be released immediately.

§ 14. Duty to report

Anyone who has fished within the regulations scope shall send a written statement of the catch for use in official statistics. When renting a fishing right, or purchasing a fishing license within the scope of the regulations, the fisherman is obliged to provide a statement of the catch to the person who owns the fishing right. Anyone who owns a fishing right is obliged to notify the State Administrator by 1 February. The catch statement must at least contain information for each day about the gear used, the fishing effort during the fishing, the number of fish by species and length, and whether the fish has been released or not.

§ 16. Control and criminal liability

All anglers are obliged to let the Norwegian Fisheries Inspectorate check that the fishing takes place in accordance with regulations (cf. section 42 of the Act on salmonids and inland fish, etc.). Violation of these regulations is punishable (cf. section 49 of the Act on salmonids and inland fish, etc.).

§ 17. Entry into force

These regulations enter into force on 1 May 2021. At the same time, regulations for fishing in Storsjøen and its falling streams and rivers, Rendalen and Åmot municipalities, Hedmark of 1 March 2012 no. 137
